# Understanding and preventing mail fraud

Mail fraud can be everywhere, and is on the rise. *What is mail fraud?* Any fraudulent activity, such as stealing information or scams, happen through the United States Postal Service.

Mail fraud schemes come in many forms. While the attacks can target consumers of any age, retirees are repeatedly the age group most impacted. Scammers can send fake mail claiming you've won a contest, or that there's an urgent need to update your profile information which then results in private information becoming compromised. So, how can you protect yourself and others against mail fraud?

#### Don't share financial information

Don't give your financial information including: card numbers, bank account information, or fill in any other personal identifying information on forms you receive in the mail unexpectedly.

#### **Read the fine print**

Read everything you're given or mailed, including the fine print before you take action.

#### **Consult with a friend**

Discuss promotions, offers, or other information with a trusted source before jumping in.

Remember, you can use Online Banking to pay bills online, or enroll in eStatements to avoid receiving statements in the mail.

It's most important to be safe. Don't give out your information, and look for signs that something might be phishy.
